The Steering committee met on Tuesday, Oct. 14. We decided on the following site fees and dates for pre-reg and lands reservations:

Site fees agreed on:

Entire event (Egils and Pregils)

Adult, non-member \$80

Adult, member discount \$70

Egils only (Fri-Mon)

Pregils only (Mon – Thurs)

No charge for minors or pets. Animals must have proof of appropriate vaccinations (rabies for dogs)

Dates of event: May 18 - May 25

Pre-reg: Open January 26 or February 1 (Depends on park fee getting tied down)

Early pre-reg, with higher land allocation: Closes March 20

Pre-reg with ANY land allocation: Closes April 20, Payment complete by/on April 28

Pre-reg, with NO LAND: Closes May 8, Payment complete by/on May 13

Payment must be made within 10 days of registration, or as noted above-- April 28 or May 13, whichever comes first.

Registration for dogs recommended (it deals with documentation for rabies), either paperwork or current tag required at gate. (When issuing bands for dog collar--"return to owner" information)

Cash only at gate for Pregils. No PayPal will be available.

Merchant fee remains at \$3 per linear foot of frontage, including guy lines. Merchants pre-register for site fee like anyone else.

Radio Options & Bids, Adhela of Ottersdam / Strata Chalup / K7SRC, v 1.0, Oct 20, 2025

Requirements

10 radios, 2 watts power preferred, no licensing obligations

Chargers, 5 spare batteries

No earpieces, mics, etc

Sat May 16 delivery, return Tue May 26

Recommendation

I recommend that we accept the bid from Event Radio for \$326. The VHF frequency radios have greater ability to cut through the tree cover, and digital radio means better sound quality over the transmission range. While it is an expense that would need to be repeated annually, it avoids three major drawbacks of purchased FRS radios– 1) strong potential for interference from other FRS users, 2) the need for a maintenance plan for the radios for long term storage, and 3) lack of spare batteries for quick change for heavily used radios.

If the council prefers to purchase rather than rent, it will be necessary to get the Costco T600 radios for any roles that need to reach outer parking directly, and the Amazon radios or equivalents should suffice for main grounds use. The Costco radios have the advantage that they charge via USB-C rather than a special charger, and that versatility is worth paying extra

for as well.

Always more to do than time for!

There's actually 4 stalls on the women's side and two stalls plus two urinals on the men's side.

As per our discussion regarding two days at Jasper SRS for approximately 200 people.

Costs involved:

- Special Use Permit = \$100
- Overnight per person = 1-25 people = \$70, over 25, each additional person = \$3
- Day fee per person if not staying overnight = 1-50 people = \$50, over 50, each additional person = \$1
- Parking fee per vehicle: \$10 per day (unless annual or two-year park pass purchased before Jan 1 = \$30/year; \$50/two year. After Jan 1, \$60/year; no two-year pass in 2026)

Congregation area is at Shelter #4. Power available, possibly water, but no guarantee (depends on temperatures). Adjacent plumbed restroom open and available.
If not too wet and muddy, can use adjacent fields for activities. If too wet, possible to use parking lots.
Overnighting area – area surrounding Shelters 1-3. Gravel/natural surface. Power available at shelters.
No water. Closest restrooms to Shelters 1-3 closed.

Officer Applications:

Scribal: Tori has applied to step up to take this office.

What is the intent to continue scribal activities? If there is a reason or interest to hold something else that can be arranged. At the moment, scribal is happening at the weekly barony evening.

There is feedback that scribal might be better served being in a different room. The additional cost would be about \$25 a week.

Concerns about conflict resolution in the future. One strong opposition to the appointment of the scribe. Notes that a response to conflict was very stressful in a class setting.

Note that in some cases, there is feedback that is received from the populace that can be heated. We may not like the way that it is given but that is a valid thing that we are here to hear.

Tori mentions that it is difficult to respond to folks interrupting a class.

Other Business:

His Excellency wanted to make sure that everyone is aware that Master Nicigorie just moved from Trimaris to the area. Their main focus is tablet weaving, calligraphy, illumination (western and islamic). Their main joy in the SCA is teaching all of the above.

Enid spoke with Legata Livia during this last Amergin's and discussed the issue of the limited number of weekends for events. The two came up with the suggestion of having our Shires host some of our championships.

This would encourage attendance to shire events and benefit the Barony in allowing us to minimize the number of event weekends that the Barony occupies. This also allows the Barony to not overtax our limited pool of autocrats. Attendance would not be a problem as the shires are nearby enough that our attendance would not be harmed.

Anton brought up that he would like to check in with our Baronial Cousins before moving on this idea but the idea was generally well received by the council.

The discussion of alternate venues for our championships did bring up further discussion on what our champions are supposed to do and who they are supposed to be: Their Excellencies said, generally, the championships are a case where the entrants come to the Baron/Baroness to ask for approval to enter. These championship roles aren't well defined as what they mean and what the job is.

It was pointed out by multiple council members that it may be something that we want to have further discussion to define. It may be worth further discussion within our customary review or in a different venue.
